The Year of Consecrated Life

In March, our monastery was chosen as the venue for the first meeting of the members of consecrated life in the diocese. This also gave us an opportunity to come to know the different religious congregations in the diocese, their charisms and ministries.

In May, the Editorial staff of the Diocesan Magazine "SIGNO" came to our house to interview some of us regarding our vocation, presence and life-style. Their publication carrying this interview had an impact on our immediate milieu - to get to know the monastery with its 22 years of presence in the Diocese of Posadas. At various times, our bishop, Mgr. Juan Ruben Martinez, said that "the contemplative life is one of the two lungs necessary for the life of the local Church. And we add: to be in good health and work effectively, it needs mutual support, trust and complementarity.
